Goddard Public Library Board Meeting Minutes

Aug 9, 2021 @7:05 pm

- 1. Roll Call: April Hernandez, Sherry Lauer, Frank Petsche, Lisa Stoller, Margo Rakes, Lisa Fouts, Lisa Coyne, Kate Morgan and Stephanie Mount were present at the library. Vickie Luthi and Tamara Judd were absent.
- 2. Approval of Agenda: Motion passed 8-0.
- 3. Approval of Minutes of Regular Meeting July 12, 2021: The Minutes were approved for the record.
- 4. Citizen Comments: none.
- 5. Correspondence and communications: State Library of Kansas / Institute for Museums and Libraries gave us a grant of \$25,000 that we used to purchase the RV that will be turned into a bookmobile, we applied for the SCKLS technology grant this morning and are waiting for approval.
- 6. Director's Report:
 - a. Humanities updated: the topics for August are "From Kansans' Military Adventures and Memorials to the 1960s and School Lunches.
 - b. Mulvane Library staff came over for a visit last Wednesday August 4th.
 - c. The Summer reading program went well. We had 630 registered and 282 completed. 233 pool passes were handed out.
 - d. We will have fewer events in August so our staff can recover from the summer reading program and gear up for our fall schedule of programs.
 - e. National night out was the 13th. Lanyards were available for board members, they contained QR codes that could be used by citizens to fill out our survey.
 - f. The seed library is set up in the library. Citizens can pick up and donate extra flower and vegetable seeds.
 - g. Wichita Area Library Association will be hosting a Meet and Great at Tanganyika by the Splash Pad on September 2 from 5:00 to 7:00. There is a \$5.00 admission.

Circulation report: July number grew from June.

7. Financial Report: Margo motioned to approve the financial report and Lisa F seconded the motion. The Report was approved 8-0.

8. Old Business:

- a. Friends/Foundation update: they did not meet in July and will not meet in August.
- b. City update April and Sherry will meet with Brian to discuss what the City of Goddard can or will do to help with the Bookmobile remodel.
- c. Early Literacy Kits A memorial donation was made for an additional kit in honor of Vickie Kilmer who passed away in January 2021. The grant was paid for by Gail Jamison.
- d. Summer Reading totals: We had 630 total patrons sign up and 282 patrons complete the challenge. There was a total of 391,477 minute read.

9. New Business:

- a. Bookmobile
 - i. Sponsorship breakdown rough draft
 - ii. Insured through Ungls for 1151.00 per year
 - iii. Kate asked if we had a time line / goal for when the remodel would be complete.
 - iv. Frank asked if the RV could be insured for less by looking into storage only insurance. April said she would look into this.
 - v. Sherry and Kate offered to update the sponsorship request letter.
 - vi. It was suggested that we have a "tip" jar out at National Night out to accept donations to go towards the Bookmobile remodel.
 - vii. It was suggested by Lisa S that we write up the story of how we were able to get the RV and how we have made it through the pandemic.
- b. There was a recap of the board training provided on August 2, 2021 by Cari Cusick Director of the Newton Public Library and a thank you card was passed around to be signed for Cari.
- c. Margo suggested that we put pictures from the end of summer reading program in the paper and the flyer that goes out in the water bill.

- d. It was suggested we get a card for Jessica of Friends foundation because her father is ill.
- e. Board Policy change: we will now have 2-year terms for President and Treasurer. This will go into effect in 2022 with the election of the new board members. Kate made the motion to approve and Frank seconded it. The motion passed 8-0.
- 10.As may be presented: Frank and Tamara edited the Board member questionnaire and has asked the rest of the board to review it and suggest any additional edits before the next meeting. Frank plans to create a new questionnaire with more room to add comments.

Sherry brought up the director evaluation process that will begin in September.

Lisa F motioned to end the meeting at 8:26 and Frank seconded the motion.


1) Do you live within Goddard city limits?




